AIR QUALITY GUIDANCE PROCEDURES

1. School nurses will provide the school with lists of “Sensitive Students.” These are students with health plans who have respiratory problems.
2. The school should monitor daily the Particulate Matter (PM2.5).
  - a. Go to the website, [www.airquality.utah.gov](http://www.airquality.utah.gov)
  - b. Click on Current Conditions
  - c. Click on Weber
3. Recommendations. The following recommendations are suggested based on the PM2.5 level.
  - a. Pm2.5 is 35 or higher – accommodate “Sensitive Students” to avoid outdoor physical activities.
  - b. PM2.5 is 55 to 90 – Accommodate students experiencing respiratory symptoms to avoid outdoor physical activities. Symptoms may include coughing, wheezing, shortness of breath, and chest tightness.
  - c. PM2.5 is 90 or higher – recommend indoor activities for all students.
4. Site based decision. The decision to limit outdoor activity based on PM2.5 levels rests with the building administration. When making the decision to restrict outdoor activity, additional factors along with the PM2.5 level such as length (15 minutes might be ok where 45 minutes is not) and type of activity (walking or sitting might be ok where running a mile might not be ok), occurrence of respiratory symptoms, and other weather conditions should be considered.
