Future plans: I hope to play, play and play some more. I'm good at that!

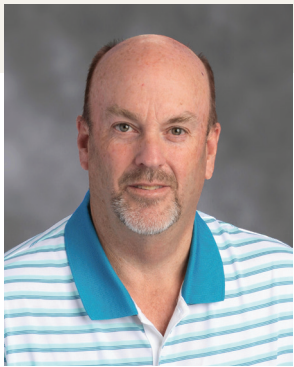
