Future plans: I plan to travel to many places, spend time with my grandchildren, hike and ski around the world, and learn about new cultures and languages.



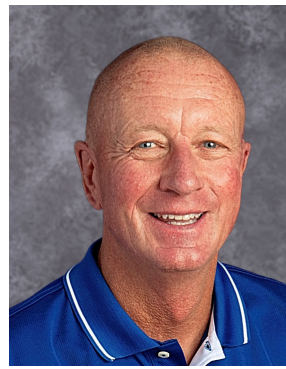
